Rising Action

- The white sheet is your “base” paper. On this sheet, follow the directions at the top of the page
- Use the four different colored sheets to write your quotes and draw the character
- File under “Textual Evidence”

Vocabulary


- The white sheet is your “base” paper

- File under “Vocabulary”

Textual Evidence

- If you need additional room, you may write on the back of the sheet (Just make sure you indicate it somehow on your sheet!)
- File under “Textual Evidence”

Socratic Seminar Ground Rules

1. Speak so that all can hear you.
2. Listen closely.
3. Speak without raising hands.
4. Refer to the text.
5. Talk to each other, not just to the leader.
6. Ask for clarification. Don't stay confused.
7. Invite and allow others to speak.
8. Consider all viewpoints and ideas.
9. Know that you are responsible for the quality of the seminar.
